President Dr. BR Bansode explained to the house that the suggestions are valid, but there is still a need for preparing an electronic record data base of all the details of the existing members. Past president Dr. Wander clarified that it's a suggestion under consideration but there are many caveats and he mentioned that rather than coming out with the problem, please send a possible proposal to the office and then only it can be discussed further in the future meetings. He also clarified the existing system of voting is time tested and very well sustainable and should be continued in the same way as before till we get any better proposals. Dr. Wander also stressed that rather than discussing on the same issues again and again, it is better to discuss more relevant and important issue for the betterment. Dr. YP Munjal appreciated the suggestion from Dr. Mahesh Marda, but again he echoed the sentiments of Dr. GS Wander that a proposal regarding the same has to be sent to the office which later can be discussed in the coming Governing body meetings. Till that time we should continue with the same method of voting for the elections. Dr. Shashank Joshi also seconded Dr. YP Munjal's sentiments and also quoted that many of the members are not happy and are uncomfortable to have electronic communications or transactions. Dr. V. Parameshwara at this stage supported the present system

of voting and concurred with the sentiments of the members to continue the present well tested system.

Some concerns were also raised for the rising registration fees for APICON, but then Dr. Amit Saraf explained to the house that the registration fees is bound to increase as the cost of daily living is increasing proportionately and he also brought to the notice of the house that the registration fees has been not raised proportionately.

President Dr. BR Bansode clarified to the house that hence forth before applying or bidding for the APICON, the branch or the chapter must be registered with charity commissioner and they should have separate PAN, TAN and GST Number. And all the bidding branches/chapters should apply with the above details only to avoid the Income tax and Auditing difficulties.

### **JAPI REPORT**

#### **EDITOR'S ANNUAL REPORT OF JOURNAL OF THE ASSOCIATION OF PHYSICIANS OF INDIA**

On behalf of all my esteemed colleagues of the Editorial Board, I take great pleasure in presenting to you the annual report of the activities of the Journal of the Association of Physicians of India during the period 1st January to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018.

The Journal has received 325 articles during the year 2018 (till December, 2018). We have published 131 Original Articles, 25 Review Articles, 61 Case Reports, 22 Pictorial CME's, and 38 Correspondences. As you are aware that since June 2018 we have stopped taking case reports in view of tremendous backlog. As of 20<sup>th</sup> December 2018 we have 78 Original Article, 07 Review Articles, 62 Case Report, 11 Correspondence pending for publication / review.

JAPI published supplement on "Management of Stroke Prevention in Atrial Fibrillation (SPAF) by Dr. Jamshed Dalal and "I CaRe for Diabetes ; Indian Guidance

on Cardio-Renal Comorbidities” by Dr. AK Das along with the March and May 2018 issues of JAPI.

## ii. Physicians Research Foundation Research Grant

The Physicians Research Foundation (PRF) invited applications from the API members who are interested in conducting research studies in the area of Medicine and its Subspecialties. The grants were widely advertised to all members by regular advertisements in the JAPI Journals, PRF website ([www.apicpprf.in](http://www.apicpprf.in)) as well during the governing body/ annual API meetings/ CMEs.

The received Research projects were evaluated by expert panel of PRF/API and also discussed in Board of Directors meeting and the final decision was made after thorough analysis and ethical clearances.

Since the inception of PRF a total of 24 Research grant application were received in the PRF office till date. There were 15 Single center studies, 7 thesis dissertations and two multi-centric study. Twelve studies out of 24 has been approved for PRF Grant by PRF Board, and at least first installment of Research grant has been released in 10 out of 12 approved projects. Two-thesis grants, from SMS Jaipur and RG Kar Medical College and Hospital respectively were selected during the 2016 PRF meetings and has been completed and awaiting publication.

## iii. PRF Website

The PRF Website [www.apicpprf.in](http://www.apicpprf.in) was launched during 2<sup>nd</sup> PRF Board of Directors meeting in Chandigarh on 10<sup>th</sup> April 2016. The website is active since then with more than 3500 hits since its inception. The website has been updated periodically and all the Recent News on PRF Research Grants, PRF Workshop on Research and publication writing as well as Thesis repository are continuously upgraded. The Thesis repository with thesis candidate, Supervisor and Co-supervisors has been put up in PDF formats and all API Members and PRF members has been requested to put up their student's thesis on website to improve their research visibility.

## iv. Physicians Research and Publication Workshops



The PRF will be releasing its 3<sup>rd</sup> publication on “Ethics in Clinical Research” during APICON 2019, Kochi, Kerala.
2. **PRF Publication and Research Methodology Workshop during APICON 2019**: PRF will be conducting “Publication workshop” during first day of ICP-CME (7<sup>th</sup> February 2019) and a “Research Methodology Workshop” on 8<sup>th</sup> February 2019 during Kochi APICON 2019.
3. **Health Assessment Study**: PRF will be conducting a Quality of Life Survey of its members by WHO BREF Questionnaire Survey in early 2019. **Schedule XVI - Notes to accounts**

**1. Organisation Status**

The Association of Physicians of India is a Society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 vide registration certificate no.25 of 1944-45 dated 23<sup>rd</sup> December 1944 issued by Asst Registrar of Joint Stock Companies, Chingleput District, Madras. The main object of the Society is to encourage and advance the knowledge, study and practice of the science of medicine in all ways. The objects also includes to encourage research, including experimental work, in the science of medicine, organize, establish, conduct, superintend or control institutions for promoting, whether directly or indirectly, the study of and research in problems relating to the science of medicine, to hold meetings and organize conferences, exhibitions, study circles or conventions for the study and discussion of problems relating to and allied with the science of medicine.

The Society has been granted an exemption under section 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961, vide letter no. CH/310-A-TC(I) issued by Commissioner of Income Tax, Mumbai City V, (application no INS/3657) dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1977. The exemption has been granted with effect from 27<sup>th</sup> June 1973. The Society also has been issued certificate under section 80-G of the Income Tax Act 1961 vide order no DIR (E)/ MC/80G/945/2009-10 dated 21<sup>st</sup> April 2009 and the validity period was 8<sup>th</sup> August 2008 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2011. As per the amendment vide Finance (No 2) Act 2009, 80G certificates which expires after 1<sup>st</sup> October 2009 are valid in perpetuity unless withdrawn by the concerned authority.

**2. Significant accounting policies**

**a. Basis of preparation of financial statements**

The Society is a Level III entity- Small and Medium Sized Enterprise (SME) as defined in the Applicability of Accounting Standards to Non-corporate Entities. Accordingly, the Society has complied with the Accounting Standards as applicable to a Level III entity. The Society is not required to present the Cash Flow Statements, Related Party Disclosures, Segment reporting and Discontinuing Operations disclosures as required under the relevant Accounting Standards. Further, the Society has availed an exemption in respect of the Accounting Standard 15 (revised) on 'Employee Benefits' and Accounting Standard 19 'Leases'.

The financial statements of the Society have been prepared under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the applicable accounting standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("GAAP") in India.

**b. Use of estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the elate of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized prospectively in current and future periods. Contingencies are recorded when it is probable that a liability will be incurred, and the amount can be reasonably estimated.

**c. Fixed assets**

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost of fixed assets includes taxes, duties, freight and other incidental expenditure related to acquisition and installation.

**d. Depreciation**

Depreciation is charged on pro-rata basis to the period of use on the written down value method using the rates of depreciation as prescribed under the Income Tax Rules, 1962 and those rates of depreciation are adequate to reflect the estimated economic useful life of the assets as estimated by the management. The primary rates of depreciation are as follows:

Furniture and fixtures	10%
Computer	40%
Equipment	15%
Buildings	10%
Intangible- Software	25%

Licensed software are being amortized as per period for which license is valid.

e. Retirement Benefit

The Society's obligations towards various employee benefits have been recognized as follows:

Short term employee benefits

All employee benefits payable wholly within twelve months of rendering service are classified as short-term employee benefits. Benefits such as salaries, allowances, are recognised in the Income and Expenditure Account in the period in which the employee renders the related services.

Post –employment benefits

Defined contribution plans:

The Society is not required to be registered with under the Employees Provident Fund Act as the number of employees are below the threshold limit and Society has not opted for voluntary registration. The society however gives a fixed amount for the employee to deposit under their respective Public Provident Fund account which contribution is charged to the Income and Expenditure Account.

Defined benefit plans:

In respect of gratuity, the liability is determined based on liability on the basis that all the employees are to retire on the reporting date. In view of limited number of employees, the Society has not carried out the actuarial valuation.

f. Leases

The Society has taken premises on operating lease? . Lease payments under operating lease are recognized as an expense in the Income and Expenditure Account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

g. Income Recognition

Donation received in cash or in kind is recognised as income when the donation is received. Donations made with a specific direction that they shall form part of the corpus of the Trust are classified as corpus donations, and are directly reflected as trust fund receipts in the balance sheet. Interest on deployment of funds is recognised using the time-proportion method, based on underlying interest rates.

Other revenue in nature of advertisement and publishing is recognized on Mercantile basis except in respect of Society's share from APICON conference is recognised on the basis of the statement of account received from the organizer and in case the statement is not received to the extent of the amount received and balance when the statement is received.

Contributions for the objects of the trust (other than members) and Contribution received from ICP Dean which are accounted for on cash basis.

h. Investments

Deposits with banks are shown under Balance with bank and Deposit with others are shown under the head "Investments". All the investments are valued at cost.

3. Corpus fund

Corpus fund relates to funds contributed by the founder members on incorporation and fees received on admission of a Member in the Society.

4. Restricted / Endowment fund

Restricted Funds are: funds that are to be used in accordance with the specific restrictions imposed by donors. The cost of administration of such funds is charged against the specific fund in line with donor agreements or understanding as arrived with the donor. The interest earned on the funds pending utilization is credited to the said fund. Amount spent from individual earmarked fund in excess of relevant fund income is charged off to Income & expenditure A/c.

5. General Fund

General funds are unrestricted funds which have not been designated for any specific purposes. They are available for use at the discretion of the management in furtherance of the general objectives of the society.

6. Employee Benefits

Defined contribution plans

Society's voluntary contribution to public provident fund maintained by the respective employees been recognized in the Income and Expenditure Account.

Defined benefit plans

Gratuity is payable to all eligible employees of the Society on resignation, retirement, death or permanent disablement, in terms of the provisions of the Payment of Gratuity Act. The liability for gratuity, as determined on arithmetical basis as on 31st March 2018 40,77,135/- (previous year- nil as not provided).

The expenditure for gratuity as determined by arithmetical basis for the year 2016-17 is Rs. (previous year Nil).

7. During the year, Society has received from its New Delhi branch the details and relevant supporting documents for the transactions undertaken by the branch from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2016 onwards. The same has been incorporated in the financial statements during the year. The details of prior Income and expenses recorded during the year is as

Further, the department has raised demand of Rs.53,20,296/- for A.Y. 2011-12, Rs. 15,23,894/- for A.Y. 2012-13, Rs. 62,67,028/- for A.Y 2013-14 & Rs. 98,97,100/- A.Y 2014-15. However, the Trust believes that the same is not payable and accordingly no provision is done in the books and has filed an appeal against the same.
9. Provision for contribution to charity commissioner is not provided for by the trust as the trust is exclusively involved in advancement of secular education as per Section 58. Further, As per the Bombay High Court Order passed on 25th September, 2009, the Charity Commissioner's office has been restrained from collecting administrative funds from charitable trusts across Maharashtra The Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950. Accordingly, the trust has not provided / paid the said contribution to the office of charity commissioner.
10. No provision for tax for the current year is necessary as the Trust will claim the exemption under section 11 of the Income Tax Act 1962 including accumulation under section 11(2) of the Act. The tax liability of Rs. 25,00,000/- in respect of the previous year has been made on the basis of the income tax return filed during the year.
11. The figures for the previous year have been regrouped/ rearranged wherever considered necessary to conform to the current year's classification.
